Twelve years ago, I asked, “Why?” God must have been saying “why not?” Now, 12 years later, I say “Thank you.” Thank you for the shared moments we have had these past 12 years.

Children & Youth

Church School Teachers/Helpers –

If you have an interest in teaching, consider which age level you would like to teach – adults, youth, children, or preschoolers. Curriculum and training are provided.

Mission Trip & Event Helpers –

We are always looking for passionate adults who have a heart for the youth and want to help. Ways you can help include helping to chaperone events and ministry trips.

Welcome Team

Welcome Office Receptionists –

As part of the weekday welcome team, receptionists extend hospitality to guests and visitors coming to the church for events or assistance.

Greeters – As part of the welcome team ministry, greeters provide the first face of hospitality to our visitors, friends and members as they enter worship on Sunday mornings and for holiday worship services.

Outreach & Service

Food Pantry - Volunteers are needed for: daytime pantries on Monday, Wednesday, Friday; evening pantries on Tuesday and Thursday; delivery unloading on Tuesdays; and re-packaging large food items into smaller containers. Shift times vary and can be adapted to a volunteer's schedule.

Shelter Meals - Volunteers assist with our church's monthly responsibility for Saturday evening dinner and Sunday morning breakfast at the Men's Shelter located at Grace Episcopal Church on the Square. Volunteers prepare food offsite, then deliver and serve it at the shelter.

Hospital Visitation Ministry

A stay in the hospital can seem long and solitary. To alleviate the loneliness and remind patients that their church cares, members of the Hospital Visitation Team monitor the Madison hospitals for names of First Church members and friends who have been admitted. Each day of the week, a team member calls the hospitals to see if any First Church members or friends are patients there, and follows up with a short visit to each person.

The visits are informal and can be made anytime during hospital visiting hours, including weekends. These visits remind the person that people at First Church care and are thinking about them. During this visit the team member also asks if the person would like to be listed in the Sunday bulletin prayer concerns or with our Prayer Team. Some team members make the calls on a specific day each week. Other members work as a pair and take turns covering alternate weeks. Some members act as substitutes and fill in when needed.

Two to three times a year, usually on a Sunday morning, the team holds a short, 30-45 minute meeting to talk about any concerns and to do any additional training which might be desired. Initial training is provided for new members.

This is a meaningful and rewarding ministry in the church. **New members to the Hospital Visitation Team are always needed and warmly welcomed. Report from the Field:

First Church Supporting the Getsemani Community in El Salvador

First Church's International Ministry Team continues to assist the Getsemani community in Ahuachapán, El Salvador through its partnership with Habitat for Humanity El Salvador. **This support presently focuses on nurturing micro businesses and assisting a reading program in the community.**

This past February, I led an 11-person team to Ahuachapán that helped build three Habitat houses in the Los Buenos Community, a neighborhood adjacent to the Getsemani Community. While there, I had the opportunity to meet with various groups in the Getsemani community that the International Ministry Team is supporting.

I shared with the **Getsemani Jewelry Group** our experience selling their hand made bracelets at our church during Advent, explaining how we had publicized and marketed the bracelets, and providing feedback on which products sold well and which didn't. We also discussed ways to facilitate the purchase of and payment for their jewelry from the United States, such as use of a picture-based order form. These discussions incorporated some valuable suggestions I had obtained before the trip from Janet Niewold at the Morgridge Center for Public Service, UW-Madison.



While there, I also purchased more jewelry from the group. I have just made arrangements to sell some of the group's bracelets, necklaces and earrings on consignment with Chiripa, a store on South Park Street in Madison that specializes in artisan goods from the Americas. These items will go on sale once we arrange with the jewelry group for appropriate publicity materials. I will place a notice in the FUMC eNews when they become available at Chiripa. Meanwhile, the International Ministry team will continue to investigate other avenues for distributing the group's jewelry in Madison and beyond.

The **Getsemani Sewing Group** is thriving. An instructor provides regular training to the 24 women currently participating. As the quality of their sewing and teamwork improves, they intend to make products for sale, including school uniforms. One of the challenges facing the group is their lack of equipment. Our team took from Madison a basic sewing machine, which we donated to the group. That donation raised the total number of their sewing machines to 14. We obtained this sewing machine from the Sewing Machine Project, a nonprofit organization based in Madison, which our team is partnering with.

Another interesting group I met with is the **Getsemani Reading Group**. This is a group of four high school students who conduct a weekly reading program for the youth in the community as part of their community service. Many of the parents in the community do not read and thus are not able to read to their children. Their community service is in exchange for a special benefit each student has received, either enrollment in a distinctive English class or a laptop computer.

This group also maintains the books given to the community, which it is using to start a small library. These books include the ones Kathi Kemp collected and took to the community as part of our 2011 Habitat trip and additional books from our 2012 team. (Kathi, a librarian and active International Ministry Team member, often staffs our table in Fellowship Hall on Sundays.) Following Kathi's instructions, our team made hand stamps for the fledgling library to use for labeling books with the library's name and marking due dates for the books they lend.



Finally, I am pleased to report that earlier this year the International Ministry team sent Habitat for Humanity International a check for \$5,400 to support the Strengthening the Getsemani Community Project. These funds were raised from a number of sources, including contributions from First Church members, team sales of coffee and other Fair Trade items in Fellowship Hall, and a grant from the Outreach Council. **On behalf of the International Ministry Team, I share a hearty thanks to all those who contributed to this support.** It is one more way that we at First Church are putting our faith into action.
