## Food Pantry Special Offering Sunday, July 15 or Online at [www.fumc.org](http://www.fumc.org) [Donate Now](#)

Our Food Pantry is very busy this summer! There will be a special offering received on Sunday, July 15, to support this ministry. Because of your love and caring generosity, the Food Pantry has served households in need in Dane County for almost 40 years. Presently, volunteer teams operate the pantry on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings from 10 a.m. - noon; and on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 5:30 - 6:30 p.m. Guests choose the items they need for their household, including fresh produce, frozen meats, canned vegetables, cereal, shelf-stable milk, infant formula, diapers and personal hygiene items.

**During March, April and May, we served 1,787 households. This represented 3,677 people, one-third of whom were children.** We learned that 630 of the households had no income; 380 had someone who was employed; and 766 households relied on fixed income such as Social Security Disability (SSDI), Supplemental Security Income (SSI) unemployment benefits and food stamps to meet their needs. In May, there were some days when we served more than 50 households during a two hour period! In addition to Food Pantry service, each weekday Narthex volunteers supply approximately 30 homeless guests with a to-go meal.

Almost every week the Prayer Team receives prayer requests from Pantry guests and others who have sought our services. In spite of the ongoing financial stresses these households face, the guests share their gratitude with Pantry volunteers, and they help and support one another. **Please prayerfully consider a gift of financial support to our Food Pantry ministry.**

The Pantry offers a wide range of volunteer opportunities for individuals and for families. Stop by our table in the Octagon on Sunday morning, July 15. We LOVE talking about the Food Pantry, what it means in our lives, and its value to our community. We will be happy to talk with you. ## RETHINKING LEADERSHIP

### Rethinking Leadership: Empowering Ministry

About 15 members of our church community gathered on Sunday, June 17 to discuss and learn more about the current initiative to rethink First Church's leadership model. This open forum, led by FUMC Council Chair Kate Vanderheiden, was the first in an ongoing series of brief touch-points designed to share ideas, questions and concerns relating to planning for successful change and making it happen within our organization. Thanks to all who are "chiming in" during this important process. Your guidance is greatly appreciated!

Positive change will always happen in successful, growing organizations. FUMC's current ministry plan (adopted by the congregation in December 2009) included changes in organizational structure which downsized the Church Council and created five "ministry councils," which are aligned with program staff. We offer here a few definitions and responses to recently-asked questions to keep you up-to-date as we continue *Rethinking Leadership* and moving towards a new "Governance and Ministry" model for our church.

#### What is this new "Governance and Ministry" model all about?

FUMC is moving towards an organizational model developed by Dan Hotchkiss which differentiates two spheres of leadership and activities. *Governance* is commonly called board work, trusteeship, strategic planning and evaluation, policymaking, oversight. *Ministry* refers to executive or program leadership, staff work, administration, management. The congregation (you) is the active foundation for both of these roles. There is good understanding and respect for "oversight" versus "management" while honoring the professional gifts of all staff.

#### Who are the "staff" and what is their role?

"Staff" includes both FUMC's paid employees as well as all unpaid volunteers. Staff facilitates the doing of ministries according to the church's ministry plans. A series of new policies is being developed, giving clear guidance to staff regarding responsibilities, authority, accountability and core processes to be followed. Our goal is to make future decision-making easier and more efficient as the church evolves and grows.

#### Who gets on the "Board" and how?

The "Board" will ultimately replace the "Council." FUMC is able to successfully attract those who are gifted to serve on the governing Board and eager to serve in clearly-defined roles. Board members are recruited for the specific skills and experience they bring to our leadership.

#### What is important? And, what should not be changed?

- Transparency, maintained via various means of timely, effective communications.
- Intentional growth of future leaders.
- Opportunities for small-group connections (committees, projects, etc.).
- Clear organizational charts help everyone know which ministry team to contact in order to be more involved or to locate needed resources for ministry.

## “Bring Your Own Ants” Picnic – Sunday, July 22 10:45 a.m. in Fellowship Hall

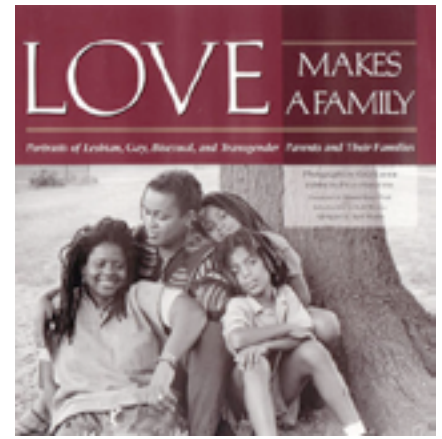

*Courage to Teach* (CTT) is a professional development series especially designed for classroom teachers, support staff, and administrators. Twenty-four educators will be selected to participate in four quarterly weekend sessions, beginning Friday evenings and ending Sunday afternoons:

January 18-20, 2013 (Winter)

Through CTT, educators will experience teacher formation, a process rooted in the belief that good teaching flows from the identity and integrity of the teacher. ## Summer Sunday School Kids Are On a Mission

The past few weeks have been fun and exciting for all the kids in the summer program. We have been discussing all the ways we can depend on God in our lives and care for others.
